The vast region conquered by Cyrus II and his descendants could not, obviously, be controlled from Cyrus' administrative capital at Ecbatana or Darius' center at Susa, and so each region had a regional governor/protector called a satrap (responsible to and representatives of the great king), rather than a sub-king, even if the satraps were often princes wielding kingly power.
